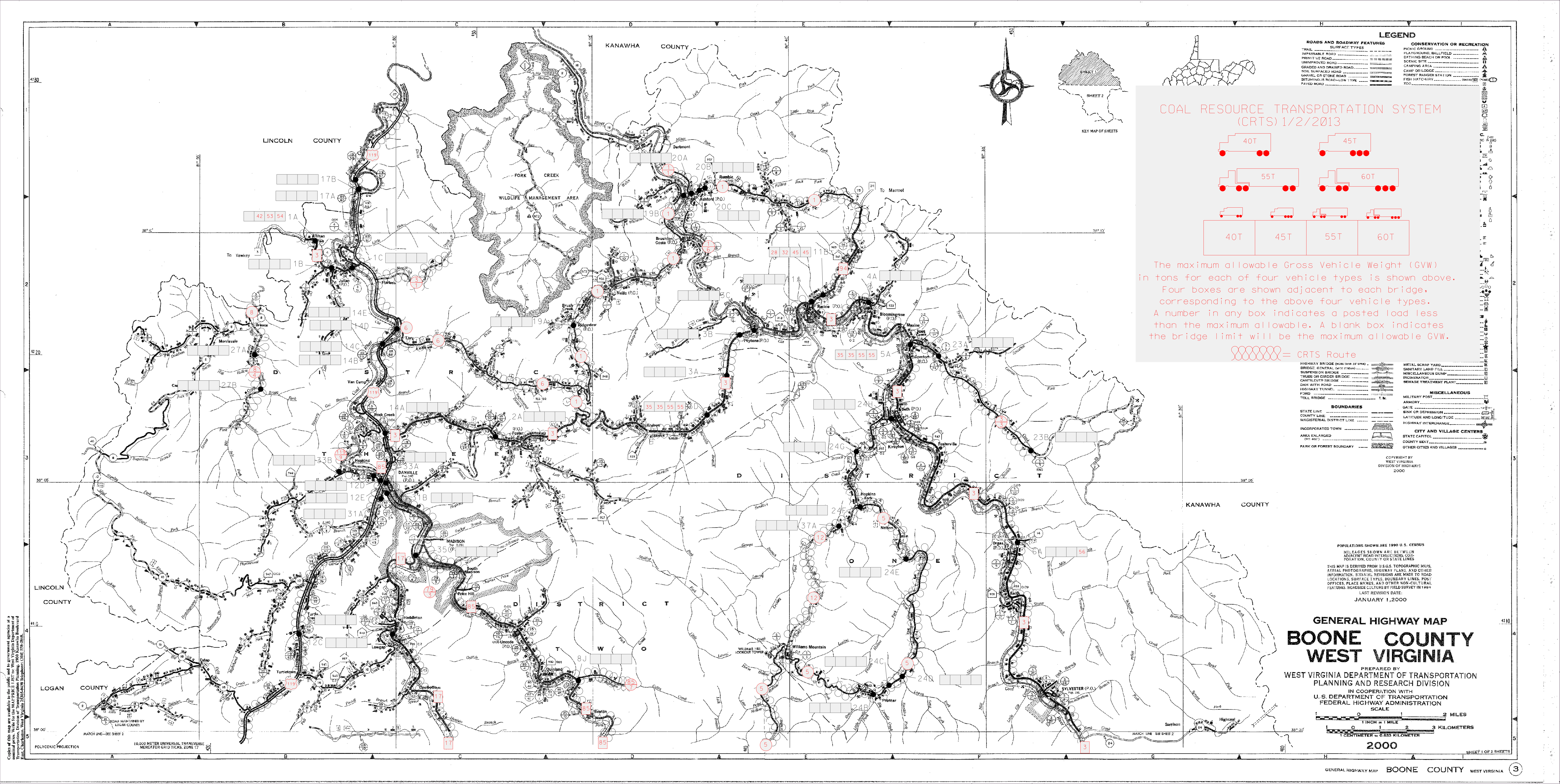
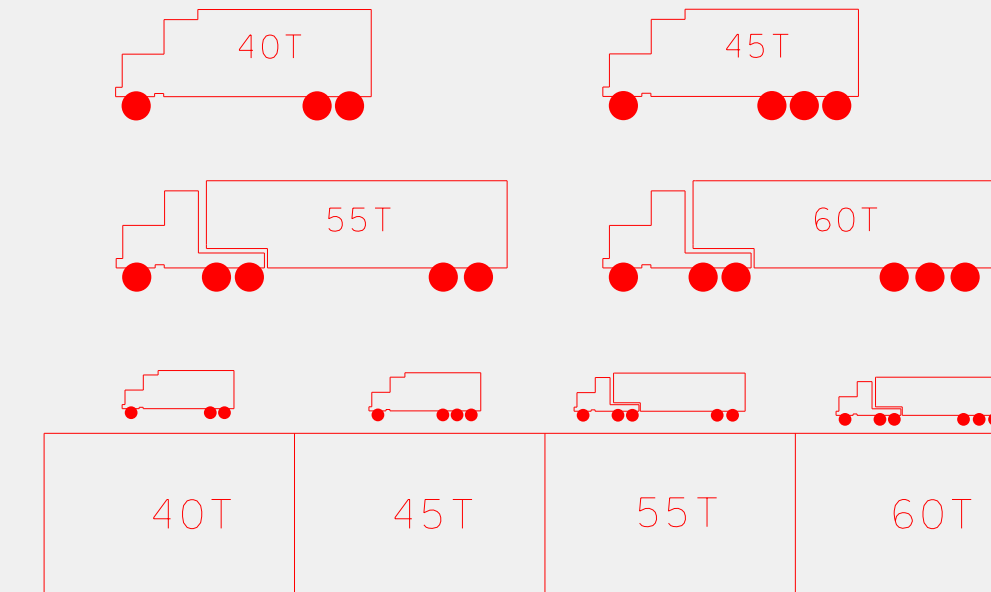

The maximum allowable Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW) in tons for each of four vehicle types is shown above. Four boxes are shown adjacent to each bridge, corresponding to the above four vehicle types. A number in any box indicates a posted load less than the maximum allowable. A blank box indicates the bridge limit will be the maximum allowable GVW.
